
























Our History

- social and cultural integration


The main asset of our organization is our team of passionate volunteers who see Ukraine's future as a prosperous democratic European nation.





Emergency Response – Our Results







Rescue Vehicles



• 38 rescue vehicles – 27 ambulances and 11 fire trucks, have been transferred to the Ministry of Health and the State **Emergency Services of Ukraine**

Life Saving Equipment and Emergency Aid

890k Euro spent on the life saving equipment and emergency aid



Tactical Medicine



- **300k Euro** spent on tactical medicine and first aid trainings

Rescue Vehicles



Ukraine is calling



Inspired by successful UAmbulance and FireMenAid projects, under which LUkraine asbl sent 14 ambulances and 2 fire trucks to Ukraine, to the regions mostly affected by war, in October'22 "Ukraine is calling" fundraising campaign was launched aimed to collect 10 million Euro to procure 112 rescue vehicles for the Ministry of Health and the State Emergency Services of Ukraine, under the respective memoranda signed.

First convoy of 12 ambulances and 4 fire trucks has left Luxembourg in December'22 to reach Ukraine right before Christmas.

8 out of 12 ambulances were kindly donated by CGDIS of Luxembourg. The rest of rescue vehicles were procured with strong contribution of CinEast Festival, Artec 3D, publi.lux, Mr. Francois Meyer and all the amazing people who've donated to support the campaign!

Second convoy of 5 fire trucks and 1 ambulance was sent in February'23.





In Ukraine rescue vehicles were handed over to the Ministry of Health and the State Emergency Services of Ukraine, and were allocated to serve in Kharkiv, Mykolaiv, Kherson, Odesa, Dnipro and Donetsk regions – the ones on frontline or the closest buffer to the frontline.

Food Packages

After the liberation of Kharkiv and some of the Donetsk and Luhansk region, an unbelievable humanitarian catastrophe became visible to the world

I Ukraine asbl committed to contribute to the humanitarian crisis relief and participate in financial support of the projects aiming delivery of product kits to affected territories.

Standard **product kit** contains basic food and hygiene items as bread, canned food, cereals, sugar, as well as candles and toilet paper.

Over the past year around 14000 product kits were distributed by brave volunteers who were ready to drive to the war zone to bring food to those who couldn't evacuate in time.





Being a Luxembourg-based non-profit LUkraine leverages partnership with the charitable funds that operate in Ukraine.

Mriya - Ukrainian Saturday School



Organized by LUkraine asl and Young Leaders asbl spring and **summer camps** for Ukrainian kids, that involved overall around 250 children, opened up a niche - how to better integrate little Ukrainians into their new reality while preserving their attachment to the homeland, - that had to be filled.

Our dream was to create an educational safe **space** filled with the Ukrainian language and culture, that would also help them to learn about their host country.

Mriya school opened its doors in October'22 and since then gathers 55 kids every Saturday in cultural center of Leudelange.

Students at school study Ukrainian language, culture, traditions, history, and geography; celebrate Ukrainian holidays. Alongside, they study Luxembourgish history and cultural heritage and get familiar with the traditions of the country. Also, they take classes in music, dance, yoga, theatre, art, and painting.





All of this wouldn't be possible without a great support of Amazon Luxembourg who financed the first year of Mriya school's ongoing expenses incurred from the normal day-to-day of running a school – paying salaries, procurement of books and consumables for kids, and other expenses on demand.

The company has also provided 60 Amazon Fire HD 8 tablets that will assist kids in their studying.













UA LU Library



Literature is a significant part of Ukrainian culture, so it is quite natural that we, Ukrainians, can't live without being able to read books in our native language.

First ever Ukrainian library in **Luxembourg** started to shape around 50 books which were donated by Ukrainians living in Luxembourg in April'22.

At official opening on June 15th of 2022 library already had to offer a great collection of Ukrainian and world literature.

"The Ukrainian language fan club" was initiated shortly after the library opening. Since then, club unites Ukrainians who are passionate about reading, poetry, history, culture and social issues.

Moreover, this is a safe and supportive space for those who've decided to switch to Ukrainian language in their daily life and can practice their skill in friendly environment.

Each meeting has a specific topic for discussion and often hosts guests who are professional in the field.





We are thankful to Ville de Luxembourg and Ministry of Education, Children and Youth of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg for the strong support and funding opportunities, as well as to numerous sponsors and partners who helped to equip the premises and continuously assist with reading catalogue update.

Currently library offers over 1'700 books, both children's and adult, and has almost 400 permanent members.

Ukraine at Europe Day

9 May is celebrated by the European institutions and agencies in commemoration of the Schuman declaration of 1950, which is seen as the key event in the founding of the **European Union**.

Every year EU organisations and Member States welcome visitors to their stands to share what their countries have to offer.

Since 2022 **Ukraine** became the only non-EU state **welcomed** to set a stand among the EU family.

Boulevard de Kyiv not Kiev

National road 3, the artery designed to be a new gateway to the capital, has been officially named **"Boulevard de Kyiv"** to show the solidarity and to draw much-needed attention to the war in Ukraine.

The decision of the city council to change the initially proposed name of "Bld de Kiev", as per French spelling, to the Ukrainian transliteration "Bld de Kyiv", speaks of how deep this solidarity is, and how much Luxembourgers understand our strong desire to 'Mir wëlle bleiwe wat mir sinn'.

"If we support Ukraine, it is obvious to respect their culture and to take care to preserve it, knowing that the aggressor would like to annihilate it", clarifies **Lydie Polfer.**
