The 'Ukraine is Calling' project, aimed to deliver 112 rescue vehicles to Ukraine, was honored with the European Citizen's Prize 2023 by the European Parliament.





LUkraine opened an office in Dnipro (Ukraine) and started on-site work just 15 km from the frontline, launching two more humanitarian projects: LUkraine Humanitarian Mission and Water to Every Home.





The inaugural **Ukrainian Days**, a festival celebrating Ukrainian art, culture, and history, premiered in Luxembourg.





LUkraine established the **Teenage Club** and Senior Club, thus covering all age groups with support.







Out people are main achievement and key asset of our organization. Volunteers and supporters, association's members and partners, employees and our projects' beneficiaries, are the ones that shape the success story of LUkraine.






FINACIAL REPORT 2023

Thanks to a good head start of 2023 with **opening balance of €544k** at our accounts, and your kind **financial contributions of €1'459k** within the year, we were able to **put €1'747k** into work for completing the project aimed to support Ukraine's brave resistance.


We are endlessly grateful to

Where Did the Funds Go?




We are proud to report that our operational expenses are as low as 5.7%, which makes LUkraine extremely lean and effective in implementation of our projects and utilization of financial donations.

Being located in the heart of Europe, LUkraine joins governmental, business, and non-profit efforts to provide Ukraine with the essentials that would support rescuers, defenders, medics and civilians in resisting Russian aggression.





Forging Resilience Together

A global fundraising emergency relief campaign to provide Ukraine with 112 fire trucks and ambulances to save more lives. All the rescue vehicles are handed over to the State Emergency Services of Ukraine, the Ministry of Health Care of Ukraine, and the Ministry of Defense. These vehicles serve Ukrainian rescuers in frontline territories in Kharkiv, Donetsk, Zaporizhzhia, Dnipro, Kherson regions.

A major part of the vehicles was delivered to the cities and villages close to the frontline or on liberated territories where neither fire trucks nor ambulances were left—they were either shelled, damaged, or stolen by Russian troops. The vehicles delivered to Ukraine within the project were spotted while rescuing lives in the hottest spots in Ukraine, helping to distinguish the aftermath of Russian missile attacks and rescuing wounded people.

As the destruction is unprecedented, we provide Ukrainian rescuers with special vehicles or equipment of such kind. Thus, the fire truck donated by the commune of Hobscheid provided a special vehicle equipped with a 30-meter-high aerial ladder. With the help of the aerial ladder, our brave responders can reach up to the 10th floor, enabling them to carry out emergency rescue operations and extinguish fires.

To highlight the evidence of the Russian army's crimes against humanity and violations of the Geneva Convention, LUkraine has exhibited destroyed emergency vehicles from Ukraine. In 2023, these vehicles were exhibited in front of the European Parliament headquarters in Brussels, at the Emergency Service Show in the United Kingdom, and in Luxembourg (Esch-sur-Alzette), France (Metz, Strasbourg), and 11 cities in Netherlands.





In spring 2023, LUkraine organized a photo exhibition dedicated to Ukrainian rescuers in Luxembourg at Gare Centrale. It featured the work of Ukrainian emergency services in real-life situations, highlighting the aftermath of Russian missile and drone attacks. The exhibition aimed to depict the scale of Russian barbaric acts.

HUMANITARIAN MISSION

The project was launched in August 2023 to assist people from close to the front line or liberated territories in Ukraine (Kherson, Zaporizhzhia, Donetsk, Kharkiv, and Dnipro regions) who do not have access to medical and social services. Working 15-20 km away from the frontline, accompanied by missile whistles and explosions, our project team, alongside volunteers, provides vital help and essential resources to ease the lives of those who either wish to evacuate or have to stay due to various reasons.

Our dedicated doctors navigate war-torn landscapes to reach villages within 10 kilometers (!) of the front line and amidst the echoes of regular shelling, reside elderly locals who, against all odds, choose to remain. These villages lack hospitals and pharmacies, making medical care challenging. Like many older individuals, residents often face health issues such as heart problems, diabetes, and seasonal illnesses. LUkraine's team, including a therapist and psychologist, procured medical equipment and medications, providing them free of charge to those in need.

Given the project's nature, which requires prompt reactions and ad-hoc interventions, LUkraine has established its representative office in Dnipro (Ukraine) to ensure the project stays on track and to provide proper coordination.

HUMANITARIAN AND MEDICAL HELP

Since the beginning of the full-scale invasion, we have already sent over 2000 tons of humanitarian aid with essentials to Ukraine. In addition to that, to support kids emotionally and give them back their childhood that was stolen by the war, together with CF Haystov, who

works in the field in Ukraine, we launched an initiative called 'Kits for Kids'. We distribute food packages containing sweets, toys,



books, and school supplies to kids who live in frontline territories.

To support the initiative, LUkraine's good friend, Michael Merten—an adventurous soul with a philanthropic spirit embarked on a remarkable journey: a charity bike tour from Luxembourg to Kyiv. Michael documented his trip on his website. As a result of the project, Michael managed to raise around 13,000 EUR!



On June 6, 2023, Russian troops blew up the Kakhovka Dam in the Kherson region of Ukraine, causing a catastrophic flood. This disaster affected 80 towns and villages along the Dnipro River, submerging houses and forcing 3,600 people, including 600 children, to evacuate their homes.

LUkraine immediately initiated a fundraising campaign for emergency relief efforts in response to this tragedy.

Overall, partnering with the Haystov Foundation on the ground, we've contributed to evacuation and humanitarian aid delivery efforts in the disaster area.

Following the critical lack of drinking water, we bought 82 tons of bottled water that our partners, CF Sky of UA, and the International Assistance Headquarters for Ukrainians helped distribute across affected areas.

However, we've searched for a more sustainable solution, thus launching the 'Water to Every Home' project, involving the drilling of artesian wells for people in cities and villages in the south of Ukraine. One drill provides permanent access to drinking water for 2000-3000 people. In 2023, the drilling of the first well started in Kamiyanka, Dnipro region.

The Ukrainian Library was opened to fill an important void of accessibility for refugees to literature in their native language, as well as to assist Ukrainians in discovering new hobbies, connecting with like-minded individuals, and providing easy access to literature in their native language.

The library offers reading clubs, meetups with Ukrainian writers, a club for Ukrainian language enthusiasts, literature evenings, and other engaging activities and events. Books' fund is continuously renewed allowing library to offer the newest publications to their readers.

MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

Forging Resilience Together

Chronic stress and disrupted protective networks have made refugees, especially children, vulnerable to trauma, poor health, and adverse life outcomes. Unfortunately, refugees' stories don't end when they escape - violence and humanitarian crises take huge tolls on people's mental health.

LUkraine offers free mental health counseling for refugees. The project aimed to assist those facing war-affected trauma, emotional or physical violence, loss of loved ones, and challenges in adapting to a new country, focusing on children, teenagers, and young adults.



For moms, who had to flee the war to protect their kids, whose husbands and partners were left in Ukraine, the peer group was launched to support each other.

LANGUAGE COURSES

Aiming to facilitate social integration and ability to gain confidence in communication and job seeking of Ukrainians under temporary protection status in Luxembourg, LUkraine provides free French and English language courses of elementary level.



These interactive courses are available for students of different ages and experience. The main goal is to go through the language barriers and fear of communication in foreign language.

In 2023, LUkraine launched Ukrainian classes for foreigners and heartily welcomes everyone who would like to learn Ukrainian as a foreign language.

Together with partners, LUkraine provides professional workshops, mock job interviews, networking, and offers professional consultations and career guidance to assist Ukrainians in securing employment opportunities in Luxembourg.

In July, LUkraine hosted a business workshop organized by Touchpoints. Over 70 ambitious individuals with business experience in Ukraine had the opportunity to gain insights into starting their ventures in the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg.



Amazon Luxembourg volunteer team initiated an interactive session focused on job searching in Luxembourg. They delved into the intricacies of Luxembourg's job market and offered valuable tips & tricks on networking, career guidance, and more.

The festival represented different kinds of Ukrainian culture. including visual arts, music, cinema, photography, design, theatre, literature, and cuisine. Visitors got familiar with Ukrainian art through exhibitions, theatre performances, concerts, literature evenings, public talks, fashion shows, and movie screenings. Within the festival, two press conferences and round tables were held to



discuss the ethnocide committed by Russia and the role of Europe in Ukrainian culture preservation.



Forging Resilience Together

The festival showcased world-renowned Ukrainian artists like Mariya Prymachenko, an outstanding self-studied artist in the genre of naive art or primitivism. In 2022, a Russian missile hit the museum in Ivankiv (Kyiv region), where Maria Prymachenko's paintings were kept. Thanks to Ukrainian volunteers and local residents who were under occupation, the artist's collection of paintings was saved. Risking their lives and hiding from shelling, the locals protected the paintings of Maria Prymachenko. Together with the Maria Prymachenko Family Foundation, we brought 5 masterpieces to introduce it to the people of Luxembourg.

The performance by Vlad Troitsky, a Ukrainian theater producer, director, playwright, and scenographer, founder of the world-known Ukrainian theater Dakh and acclaimed band Dakh Daughters, became the headliner of Ukrainian Days in Esch-sur-Alzette. "A Mother's Heart: Children Keep All Our Tears" is a documentary and musical performance depicting the tragedy of mothers whose children are on the front line. The performance is based on personal texts written by Ukrainian mothers to their sons during Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, including letters from women in a bomb shelter in Mariupol and a woman from Lviv whose two sons died on the front line.

RECOGNITION OF HOLODOMOR AS A GENOCIDE

Forging Resilience Together

Holodomor (1932-1933) was a man-made famine caused by the Soviet regime to punish independence-minded Ukrainians who posed a threat to totalitarian authority. Total losses are estimated at 4.5 million, with 3.9 million excess deaths and 0.6 million lost births. Twenty-eight countries have already recognized Holodomor as a genocide against Ukrainians.

In 2017, LUkraine started the first petition in Luxembourg to recognize Holodomor as a genocide. Since that moment, demonstrations and remembrance activities have taken place annually on Holodomor Memorial Day. Thanks to these efforts, in 2023, the Luxembourgish government recognized Holodomor as a genocide.
